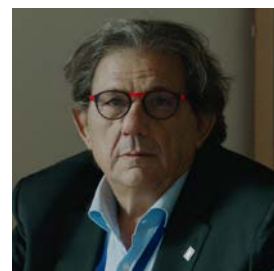

Biography Note

Born in Athens, Greece, I studied medicine in Thessaloniki and later moved to London and Paris, where I trained in Child Neurology. This rather complex journey authorizes me to claim, and be proud of, a profoundly European personality.

Meeting *Jean Aicardi* determined the rest of my medical career. He was my teacher, he initiated me to paediatric clinical epileptology, he is “responsible” for my attachment to France and its public health system. I will always honor him as my mentor and remember him as a very close friend. *Emilio Fernandez-Alvarez* and *Jaume Campistol* also largely contributed to my resolutely clinical approach of medical practice; to my rather rudimentary knowledge of the Spanish language and my admitted attraction for Latin American countries and cultures. *Fred Andermann* was the one who arouse my curiosity for early epilepsy surgery.

Since 2008, after more than 25 years in Paris (Necker-Enfants Malades, Salpêtrière and Robert Debré university hospitals), I moved to Lyon where I contributed, together with a team of excellence, to the creation of a rather unique in France hospital department, combining paediatric epilepsy care and clinical neurophysiology. I am honored, since 2014, to also contribute, as Research Coordinator, to the creation of an equivalent paediatric epilepsy unit at the Barcelona Children’s hospital in Spain.

During all these years I also strongly committed myself to missions related to the activities of scientific societies and patient associations – in France, in the EU and internationally - in the fields of Child Neurology and clinical epileptology. My main non-medical activities are most frequently oriented towards educational projects, but not only. Probably my most significant contribution was to closely accompany the creation of an epilepsy journal dedicated to clinical semiology, today the educational journal of the ILAE *Epileptic Disorders*. I combined this activity with the organization of several workshops and training courses for young clinicians from across the world, workshops that often led to the publication of books.

My clinical and research activities mainly concern the pharmacological and surgical management and genetics of childhood epilepsies also focusing on issues related to cognitive function and dysfunction. I am involved in several European collaborative studies on rare neurological disorders, published more than 160 articles in peer-reviewed journals, co-authored the latest edition of "*Aicardi's Epilepsy in children*" and co-edited several books in the field, including the 4th edition of the "*Aicardi's Diseases of the Nervous System in Childhood*" (McKeith Press) and the first book on *Pediatric Epilepsy Surgery* (John Libbey editions).

My most recent passion, result of my recent role in the EU Reference Network for Rare and Complex Epilepsies ERN EpiCARE: *contribute to the development of public health services across the EU accessible to all*. Health services working in close collaboration at an EU and international level at the service of the patients, independently of their origins.
